- This competition is open to any age or difficulty level and repertoire may be chosen from any historical period.
- The music of J.S. Bach can now be included as well.
- Only ONE composition or ONE movement may be chosen for performance.
- Repertoire must consist of an original composition simplified versions are discouraged. Refer to the Certificate of Merit Syllabus for acceptable arrangements.
- Repeats, other than first and second endings, are discouraged.
- Students are expected to perform from memory (except for ensemble performances) and it is customary for students to bow before and after their performance
- Students shall provide the judges with original music scores, opened at the pieces to be performed and with the first measure of each line numbered
- No photocopies are allowed
- Adjudication will be based on the following age categories: age 8 and under, 10 and under, 12 and under, 14 and under,16 and under, age 17 and over and one Instrumental category (all ages)
- Trophies are presented to the winners in each age category.
- Winners from the previous year's competition compete in a separate Winners Program.
- Please note that the Hollywood Branch may use images of the participants and audience on our branch website.

Dress code guidelines:

A dress or elegant pants outfit for females and long dress pants, dress shirt, dress shoes (no sports shoes) for males.

Two Grand Prizes:

- Senior Grand Prize (age 13 and above) \$100
- Junior Grand Prize (age 12 and under) -\$100
- The Grand Prize awards will be limited to a one time win per student.

• A completed and signed consent form

• Please submit the Consent form to the event chair with your check.

Please, join our Zoom Meeting on this date. We have a very special guest speaker, Dr. Jacqueline Petitto, who will give a presentation on Musicians Wellness, followed by Questions and Answers discussion.

Promoting musical wellness among performing musicians, music students and teachers, has many different disciplines. Occupational injuries for musicians can take many forms: psychological (performance anxiety), physical (repetitive motion, tendon/muscle injuries, backpain), hearing-related injuries and emotional issues. Dr. Petitto is an expert in the field of Musical Wellness. She will address many of these issues and inform us on how to cope with many of them. Please, read Dr. Petitto's biography below.

Pianist Jacqueline Petitto is an active soloist and chamber musician who has performed throughout the United States, Canada, Latin America, China and Hong Kong. Dr. Petitto received both Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees in piano performance from the University of Southern California Thornton School of Music, and her Bachelor of Music *cum laude* from Santa Clara University.

With over 25 years of private piano teaching experience, Dr. Petitto has taught an array of music courses at USC, University of La Verne, Pasadena City College, Los Angeles City College, University of Hong Kong and Hong Kong Baptist University. She was a faculty member of the Colburn School Conservatory of Music (for ten years), and Assistant Professor of Piano/ Director of Keyboard Studies at Long Beach City College.

At Colburn, Dr. Petitto taught all levels of ear training and created a Musician Wellness course. She has extensive experience in the field of wellness including a regular yoga practice since 1998 and years of Alexander Technique private lessons with pianist Dr. Heidi Brende. In addition, Dr. Petitto has taken classes in Dalcroze Eurhythmics, Tai Chi, Meditation, Mat Pilates, Movement Training for Musicians, Nutrition, and received sessions in chiropractic care, massage therapy, physical therapy and hand therapy. Her interest in musician wellness emanated from her own struggles with an injury as a graduate student. Dr. Petitto's strong commitment to this most important topic has resulted in her 2019 appointment as CAPMT Wellness Chair. She has given successful presentations at different universities, music teacher organizations and conferences, and translated a musician wellness book from Spanish into English.

Dr. Petitto offers individualized Piano Wellness coaching and consultations, and writes the Musicians' Wellness column for the CAPMT Connect Journal since 2020. She is currently among the music faculty at Long Beach City College.
