- This competition is open to any age or difficulty level and repertoire may be chosen from any historical period.
- The music of J.S. Bach can now be included as well.
- Only ONE composition or ONE movement may be chosen for performance.
- Repertoire must consist of an original composition simplified versions are discouraged. Refer to the Certificate of Merit Syllabus for acceptable arrangements.
- Repeats, other than first and second endings, are discouraged.
- Students are expected to perform from memory (except for ensemble performances) and it is customary for students to bow before and after their performance
- No music scores are required for the Winterfest
- Adjudication will be based on the following age categories: age 8 and under, 10 and under, 12 and under, 14 and under,16 and under, age 17 and over and one Instrumental category (all ages)
- Trophies are presented to the winners in each age category.
- Please note that the Hollywood Branch may use images of the participants and audience on our branch website.

Dress code guidelines:

A dress or elegant pants outfit for females and long dress pants, dress shirt, dress shoes (no sports shoes) for males.

Two Grand Prizes:

- Senior Grand Prize (age 13 and above) \$100
- Junior Grand Prize (age 12 and under) -\$100
- The Grand Prize awards will be limited to a one time win per student.

Application Requirements:

- A completed and signed consent form
- Please submit the Consent form to the event chair with your check.

- Participants must have a Consent Form on file unless you submit a formal objection. Participation, plus a completed consent form, signify acceptance of these postings

Deborah H. How (piano, flute) received her Bachelor of Arts from Swarthmore College, Masters of Aarts from the UCLA School of Music, PhD from the USC Thornton School of Music, and MBA from the Isenberg School of Management at UMass Amherst.

Dr. How is widely known as a connection builder and fundraising architect for nonprofit music organizations. She is a frequent presenter on both studio management and pedagogy topics and is a member of the MTNA Business Resource Network.

Deborah How maintains an active studio with national competition winners in piano, flute, chamber music, and composition, and is the owner of the Westside Music Conservatory in Los Angeles (Brentwood).

Committed to community service, Dr. How also holds chairperson and/or committee positions at several non-profit organizations, including the Westside Music Foundation, Vicente Chamber Orchestra, Southern California Junior Bach Festival, Southwestern Youth Music Festival, and MTAC Santa Monica Bay.
